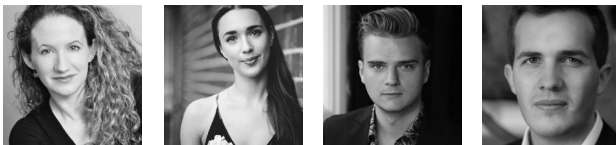

Choral Workshop

The seventh Edington Arts Choral Workshop will be led by Simon Carrington, founder member of The Kings Singers, Emeritus Professor of Choral Conducting at Yale in the US, and now a freelance conductor and sought-after workshop leader, taking workshops and master classes round the world. We are very fortunate to have found a gap in his busy schedule to lead a workshop in the Priory Church; we will be exploring a twentieth century British theme, including Britten's astonishing 'Rejoice in the Lamb', and one or possibly two other short 20th century British works. The Metamorphoses Trio

The Metamorphoses Trio is an interesting combination of instruments - piano, clarinet and viola - played by world-class established solo musicians who founded the trio in 2016. Ilona Timchenko (Russia), Jean Johnson (USA) and Roeland Jagers (Netherlands) offer a unique opportunity to explore music written for this instrumental line-up, from Mozart's Kegelstatt Trio to Russian elegies, Schumann and the best of German romantics. Their performances are "sincere, imaginative and as fresh as paint" according to Gramophone UK, and their first CD received magnificent reviews.
